Theatre Royal Plymouth Lab Associate Chris White Set for His London Debut

Chris White, a former Lab Associate at Theatre Royal Plymouth is premiering his show *Moist, Moist* at The Pleasance Theatre in London from 17 – 21 August. Chris, who is the recipient of the 2021 National Partnership Award, is a Devon based poet & performer who creates silly, surreal and accessible spoken-word.

Starting his journey with TRP in 2018 Chris developed his show *Moist, Moist, Moist* as part of the theatre's Lab Associate programme. Since then he has secured a London premier of the show at The Pleasance where his part poetry, part-stand up, part gig will take centre stage.

Chris White said: "I was a Lab Associate at TRP a couple of years ago, and developed Moist, Moist, Moist as part of that, alongside my long-suffering co-star and musician Hal Kelly.

"Moist, Moist is a show about a man who travels down to Plymouth from the Midlands, who meets and falls in love with the sea. I'm a Midlander myself and now live in Devon, so it's semi-autobiographical.... It's a show all about queer love, sex & relationships. I wanted to write something about my own experiences, and about being diagnosed with HIV a few years ago, so I chose to do it through this really silly, sprawling & extended metaphor.

"It's a really fun show to perform, with lots of stupid songs and gags chucked in amongst the heavier stuff. It deals with some big ideas about relationships and self-acceptance, but in a way that won't make you gag. It's got a really warm and positive message. The music from Hal is fab. It's definitely spoken-word for people who don't like spoken-word... and hopefully also for people who do..."

Ben Lyon-Ross, Talent Development Producer at Theatre Royal Plymouth said: "I couldn't be happier to see Chris's show Moist, Moist, Moist going to London as











Part of the national partnership programme. It's witty and inventive and spreads a feel-good vibe, which I think audiences will really love. As part of the Lab Associate programme, we supported Chris with, finance, programming, artistic support and rehearsals space. The programme offered Chris the context to develop his practise and I think he's made a truly brilliant show!"

This performance will be in *Pleasance Downstairs* which is operating at a maximum of 80% capacity to provide additional spacing to customers as restrictions relax. This is in addition to enhanced cleaning, additional hand sanitation stations, and improved ventilation throughout performances to provide the safest theatre experience possible. He's an ex-Bard of Exeter, and a multiple slam winner who has had work commissioned by Cape Farewell, Apples and Snakes, and Exeter UNESCO City of Literature.
