Director's Note

When Sam and the team at Paines Plough asked me to direct this show it was an absolute no-brainer. Sam's writing always strikes a chord with me. His characters and the worlds they inhabit are impeccably well-observed, and speak completely to my own lived experience. We are close collaborators but also friends, and we had spoken about this idea a long time before Paines Plough picked it up, so when I got the call, I was ready to go. Paines Plough are a company I've long been inspired by and wanted to work with.

At its heart *Sorry, You're Not A Winner* is a play about male friendship, leaving home and struggling to navigate how to exist in a class system that aims to institutionalise you. It's about how you can exist in a world where you feel like you need to change to fit in and, in doing that, feel as if you never really fit in anywhere. I suppose it's a coming-ofage story that centres around two working class kids from Worcester, but the themes will resonate with anyone who has felt some pressure to assimilate, and how that affects one's sense of self and the relationships we hold dear.

It's been fantastic working at the Theatre Royal Plymouth with this cast and creative team to bring Sam's words to life. I hope you enjoy watching it as much as we have enjoyed making it.


