



- What does it mean to **consume** something?
- What does the word **repurpose** mean?

#### Write

Listen to the song 'Everything Your Never Wanted'. The opening to the song asks:

#### "What do people think happens to the things that they don't want anymore?"

Every person in the UK produces about 400kg of domestic waste each year - equivalent to the weight of an American Bison! Each of us has a role to play in reducing the amount of waste that is... well, wasted! This is where the **Four R's** come in: **Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Repurpose**.




#### Task 4:

Repurposing something is a great way to reduce waste. Take something you no long use or need, that you might otherwise throw away, and repurpose it.


You can do this with anything you like! Search the internet for ideas, or you could try making a tote bag out of an old T-shirt using the instructions below!

### MAKE A T-SHIRT TOTE BAG



Unfolded, your bag should look like this

Take your regular T-shirt and fold it in half. Cut it to make you bag handles.





After folding and stitching, your bag should look like this



Turn your T-shirt inside out, then sew along the bottom. Turn it out again, and you'll have a tote bag!

If you don't own a sewing machine or can't sew, instead you can 4cm long, 1cm wide strips at the bottom, and tie them together. If you don't want the strips to hang out, turn your shirt inside out before tying your strips together.



- Brewing the perfect cup of tea
- · Buildng a wooden raft
- Sorting toys alphabetically
- Spelling

- Garden mowing


